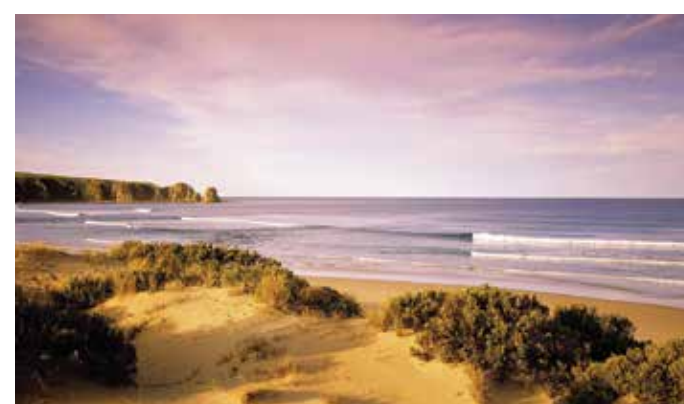

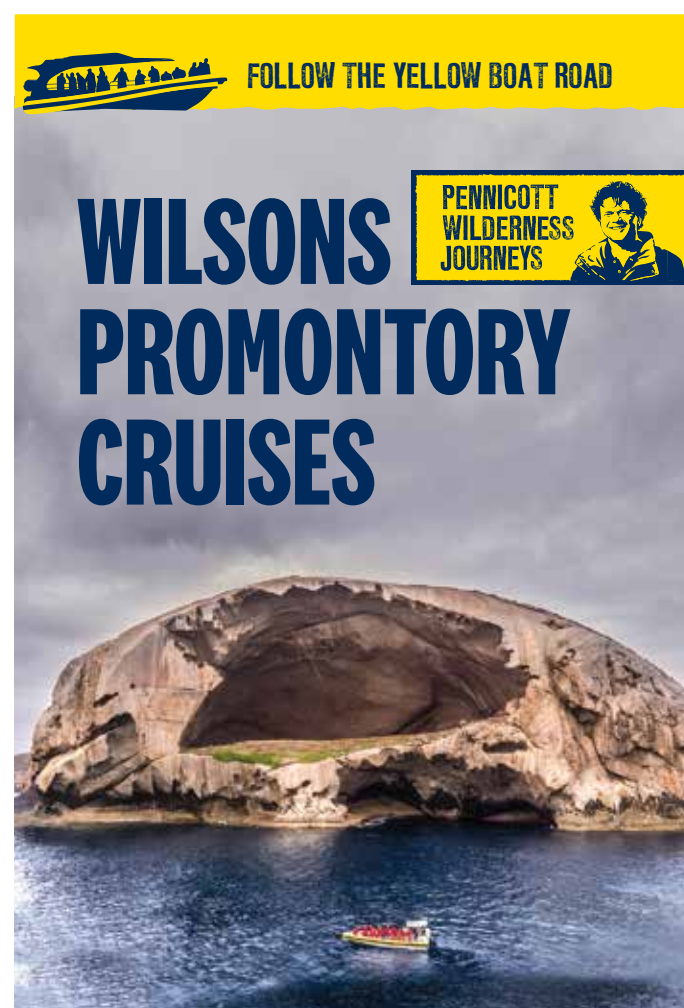

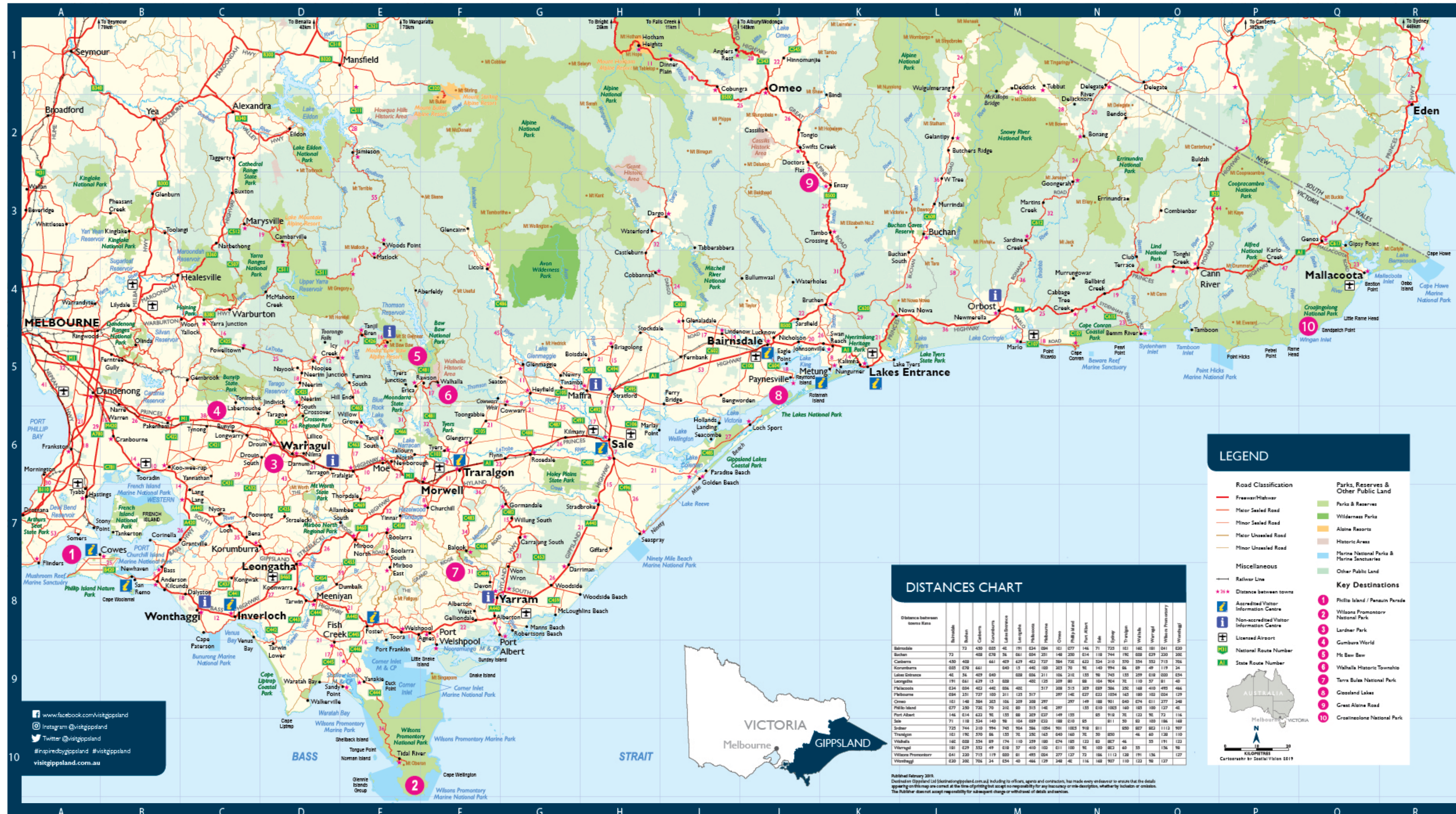
From rolling hills to rugged coastlines, white sandy beaches, national parks, vibrant towns and villages to mountainous terrain there really is something for everyone.

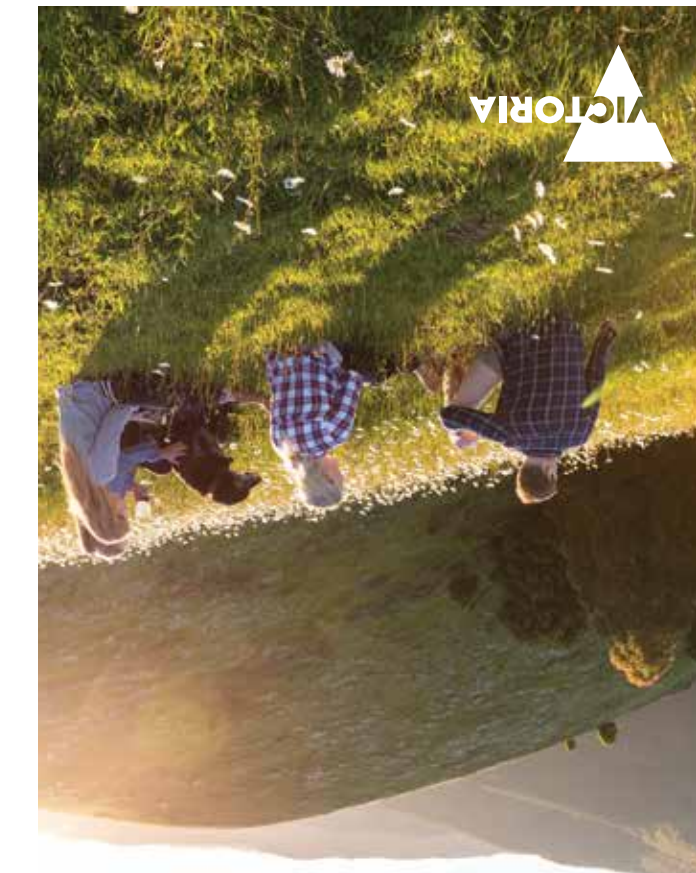

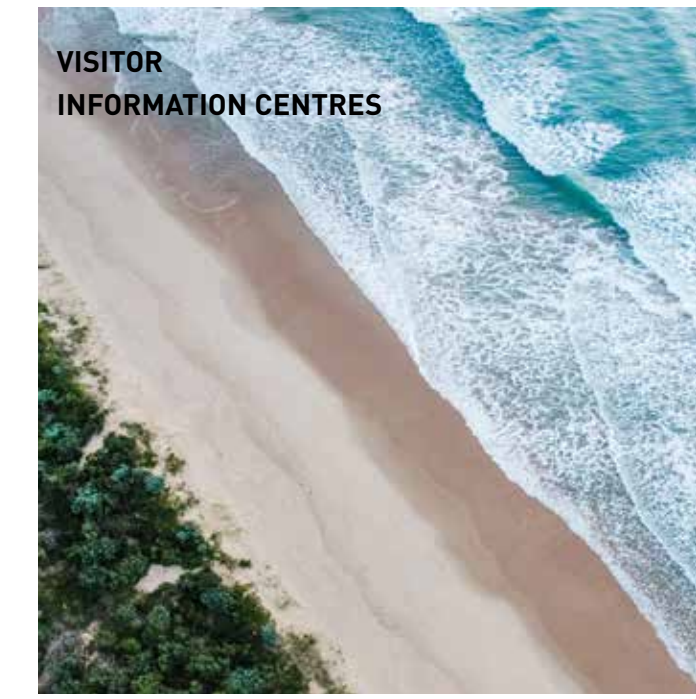
